CANTEEN HELPERS

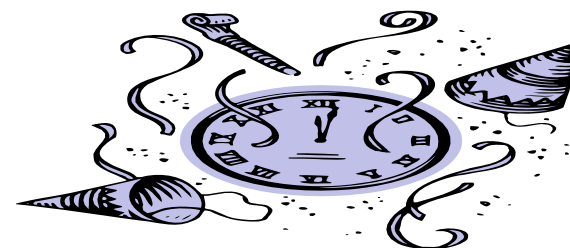

Healthy Queensland Awards

The Premier has announced that Queensland schools, communities and workplaces have the chance to share in a competition prize pool of \$1.6 million.

The Healthy Queensland Awards are being run by Keep Australia Beautiful Queensland and entries for these inaugural awards are now open:

- The Healthiest Community can win \$1 million
- The Healthiest School can win \$500,000
- The Healthiest Workplace can win \$100,000.

The winning awards will be for "healthy" infrastructure projects or programs — for a community or a school it might be for a swimming pool, a basketball court or a bike path.

Judging will take place across 12 regional areas – Far North Queensland, North Queensland, Whitsunday – Isaac – Mackay, Central Queensland, Western Queensland, Wide Bay-Burnett, Darling Downs, South West Queensland, Sunshine Coast, Brisbane, Inland South East Queensland and Coastal South East Queensland. These regional winners will then go into the State Awards.

More than 4300 Queenslanders die prematurely every year from preventable chronic diseases. Our community can lead by example and tackle chronic disease head-on in our own backyard.

Entries, which close on 27 March 2009, should demonstrate that the project has support from the wider community.
